Hi Claudio and Michael

Hope everything is well on your end. I am writing you because we need to get started planning the SKB hearing 12-16 December. Could you please confirm the preliminary schedule and provide more details so that we can get started looking for an appropriate venue and hotel. Specifically, we need to know:

- how many days you will need hotel and meeting room(s)
- When the IRT-members will arrive and depart
- what field trips you want to make and when
- Expectations on presence of SKB (what experts and when)
- Requests for meals during your stay
- Any other relevant information

The first bullet is the most critical one because we need to book the conference venue as soon as possible.

As agreed SSM will book the venue, arrange for meals and block rooms at the hotel. NEA will reimburse cost for travel directly to the IRT members. The IRT members are expected to make their own room reservations and travel arrangements. If we get a clear indication (soon) of what field trips you want to make, we can discuss with SKB how to help out with transportation from Stockholm to Oskarhamn and Forsmark, respectively.

As you might recall from the press conference there was some interest from NGOs to participate at the hearing. We are discussing various options to achieve transparency while maintaining some kind of "order and privacy" for the IRT. One possibility is to invite a limited number of representatives from stakeholder organisations, concerned municipalities etc as observers in addition to SSM. This could be doable but it might be difficult to draw the line.... If many review bodies and members of the public show an interest. Another possibility could be to set up a web broadcasting facility. Would this be

acceptable to the IRT members?

Please let me know what you think.

Once we have agreed on how to proceed, please note that Karin, will be your point of contact for all practical arrangements.
